SCOPE OF WORK

This classification allows the licensee to install, alter, or repair non-structural ornamental metal, such as:

- Metal folding gates
- Guard and hand rails
- Wrought iron fencing and gates
- Window shutters and grilles
- Room dividers and shields
- Metal accessories common to the industry

This classification does not allow the licensee to install fire escapes or stairs.
