PRETEST ITEMS

In addition to the number of questions per examination, a small number of five to ten “pretest” questions may be administered to candidates during the examination. These questions will not be scored and sufficient time to answer them is included in the examination time. The administration of such nonscored experimental questions is an essential step in developing future licensing examinations.
